HORSE DEPARTMENT GENERAL RULES

1. 4-H and FFA Horse forms are due in the Horse Office no later than **5 p.m. on June 4, June 4th postmark accepted. THERE WILL BE NO POST ENTRIES FOR 4-H AND FFA.** All other horse forms are due by 5 p.m. on Thursday, June 25th or they will be considered post entries. Post Entries: Management reserves the right to limit the number of post entries. 4-H & FFA project books should be available upon request.
2. **NOTE – ALL POST ENTRIES (Not including 4-H/FFA or Calf Branding) WILL BE ACCEPTED UP TO ONE DAY (24 HOURS) PRIOR TO THE EVENT (AND THE STARTING TIME OF EVENT) AS STATED IN HANDBOOK. NO EXCEPTIONS. Post entries are charged double entry fees.** No checks will be accepted after June 25th, thereafter, fees must be paid by cash, cashiers check, or money order.
3. All exhibitors and rodeo horses must enter the gate on the west side of fairgrounds designated as gate #9. Register at the Horse Show Office upon arrival. For safety purposes exhibitor vehicles must be removed from the horse barn and paddock area, by 7 a.m., until conclusion of judging.
4. HORSES ARE NOT REQUIRED TO STALL ON THE GROUNDS. Anyone wishing to stall must indicate on the entry form the dates needed so that appropriate stalls may be assigned. Stalls will be available on a first come, first served basis at the fee of \$15.00 per night. There will be a very limited number of stalls available for the Open Horse show on Sunday July 26th. The exact number will be available after June 15th. SHAVINGS ARE NOT INCLUDED WITH THE STALL RENTAL, BUT WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR SALE. Please contact the Horse Show Office for stall availability before submitting entry form. Stalls must be paid for at time of reservation. Reservations will be taken starting June 15th. For insurance purposes, horses stalled must be entered in a horse department event. **NO REFUNDS FOR STALLS (AS PER STATE RULE II. ELIGIBILITY #6).**
5. 4-H/FFA entrants may rent stalls from July 19th through July 22nd for a fee of \$5.00 per day. **4-H/FFA Horse Leaders will be responsible for submitting all stall requests. Contact your Horse Leader for all requests. Stall requests must be submitted to the Horse Office no later than Thursday, June 11th, by 5:00 p.m.** 4-H/FFA only will receive one bale of shavings per horse. Shavings will be available for sale. Please put number of stalls and dates needed on entry form due June 4. Tack stalls will be allowed if space permits.
6. Representative breed exhibits are encouraged to display their horses at the fair. We are organizing the paddock area for demonstrations this year. For more information and reservations, contact the Horse Department by July 16th.
7. No person other than officials, stewards and attendants on duty and the judge of the division being exhibited will be admitted to the show ring. Exhibitors must stay out of the arena unless exhibiting.
8. Numbers will be assigned to each exhibitor. Exhibitors will not be allowed to participate in division unless numbers are properly displayed.
9. **REFUNDS CAN BE REQUESTED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS ONLY (AS PER STATE RULE II. ELIGIBILITY #6), AND MUST BE SUBMITTED IN WRITING PRIOR TO THE EVENT IN WHICH THE ANIMAL IS ENTERED:**
 - a) **sickness – must include doctor’s certificate**
 - b) **accident or death**
 - c) **cancellation of a class or return of entries for lack of exhibit space**
 - d) **health or soundness of animal – must include veterinarian’s certificate**
10. The fair is not responsible for exhibitor errors on their entry forms. **No refunds** will be issued for incorrect information on entry forms.
11. Extended Divisions limited to residents and producers of Stanislaus, Merced, Calaveras, Tuolumne and San Joaquin Counties. Open Divisions are open to residents of the United States. Local Divisions are open to residents and producers of Stanislaus County, and that portion of Merced County north of the Merced River served by the Turlock Irrigation District.
12. The Stanislaus County Fair reserves the right to limit entries to available facilities.
13. When necessary, management reserves the right to limit the number of entries per exhibitor to 10 head.
14. Ponies may not be entered in any rail class not specified "Pony Class," except lead-line or equitation.
15. Livestock (including horses) must be owned for thirty (30) days for senior department exhibitors and 120 days for junior department exhibitors prior to the opening date of the fair. All state rules apply.
16. **NO DOGS ON GROUNDS OR IN PARKING AREAS DURING FAIR EVENTS, OR ANIMAL CONTROL WILL BE CALLED.**
17. Full name, including middle initial must be on all entry forms.
18. 4-H and FFA classes may be combined or split in order to balance class sizes.
19. FFA members are *required* to have their record books checked or submit a signed verification form with entry.
20. **NO CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 25th, THEREAFTER, FEES MUST BE PAID BY CASH, CASHIERS CHECK, OR MONEY ORDER. NO EXCEPTIONS.** A fee of \$25.00 will be charged for each returned check.
21. Pony height and 4-H rules will be enforced. Rules available through the 4-H Leaders or FFA Advisors.
22. Picnic tables and benches are not to be moved. **No camping in the stall area.**
23. Verification forms for each 4-H horse must be on file with the County 4-H Office by March 19th.
24. There will be a **\$5.00** fee for all substitutions, CASH ONLY.
25. **Mule** Classes w/premiums will be paid as follows: 9+ entries=4 places, 7-8 entries=3 places, 5-6 entries=2 places, 4 or less entries=1 place
26. **ONLY REGISTTERED HORSE EXHIBITORS MAY BE ON HORSEBACK – AT ANY TIME, NO EXCEPTIONS**

STATE RULES

1. **FIVE DOLLARS PER HORSE OR PONY DRUG FEE.**
2. Unless other rules are specified, the rules and regulations prescribed by the Division of Fairs & Expositions of the California Department of Food and Agriculture will be followed.
3. Photocopies of registration certificates for horse shows may be permitted for the purpose of submitting entries. However, if the fair receives any complaint or challenge concerning the registration of any animal, the fair may request an original registration certificate and may disqualify the entry if it cannot be produced.
4. No more than one owner per animal. THREE ENTRIES BY TWO OR MORE EXHIBITORS CONSTITUTE A MINIMUM HORSE SHOW CLASS. Where entries are less than a minimum class at the closing date of entry, the class may be cancelled. Cancelled entries may be transferred without Penalty into other classes of the same division. Should entries fall below the minimum after the closing date of entry, a class may be continued with premiums at the discretion of the management.
5. For horse show purposes, the exhibitor’s age on the previous December 1 shall be maintained the entire year (for junior mount classes only).
6. Junior exhibitors (under 18 years of age) will be allowed to enter stallions in the Senior Department, but cannot ride or show stallions.
7. Exhibitors found in violation of rules or in practices unethical or inimical with the fair program shall be penalized by forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances. The management shall report any such exhibitors to the Division of Fairs and Expositions in writing and such reports may become the basis for any other fair to refuse entries.

All Horse Show entry forms (except 4-H & FFA) are due in the Horse office no later than **Thursday, June 25th, by 5 p.m.**

ADDITIONAL RULES FOR OPEN MULE SHOW

1. NOTE – ALL POST ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UP TO ONE DAY (24 HOURS) PRIOR TO THE EVENT (AND THE STARTING TIME OF EVENT) AS STATED IN HANDBOOK. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Post entries are charged double entry fees. No checks will be accepted after June 25th; thereafter, fees must be paid by cash, cashiers check, or money order.
2. Camping will be available in the North Parking Lot to exhibitors entered in the Stanislaus County Fair Open Mule Show. Water and portable toilets available. Please contact the Horse Office for additional information at (209) 632-2767, after June 2nd.
3. Mule Classes w/premiums will be paid as follows: 9+ entries=4 places/7-8 entries=3 places/5-6 entries=2 places/4 or less entries=1 place
4. All exhibitors entering in the mule show are required to pay a \$2.00 assessment fee per animal, per class, as stated in the AMA Rules.
5. All American Mule Association rules apply. All State and Local rules apply.
6. Youths are required to wear an approved safety helmet whenever mounted or riding in wagon or cart at an AMA approved event.
7. For a complete list of State Rules, please visit their website www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe
8. **A map of the Stanislaus County Fairgrounds is included on the back inside cover of this handbook.**
9. Mules are not required to be stalled on the grounds. Anyone wishing to use the fairgrounds stalls or corrals, must indicate on the entry form the dates needed so that they may be assigned. The fee is \$15.00 per night per animal. Exhibitors may still utilize the North Parking Lot with their own equipment at no charge.

4-H & FFA SHOWMANSHIP

- Entry forms are due in the Horse office no later than **Thursday, June 4th, by 5 p.m.** **June 4th postmark accepted.** ENTRIES IN SHOWMANSHIP MUST BE ENTERED ON THE ENTRY FORM, and submitted by the entry deadline. **No showmanship entries will be accepted after the entry deadline of Thursday, June 4th by 5:00 p.m.** Exhibitors must enter in an appropriate performance class to be eligible for showmanship. Refer to State Rules.
- The winners of 4-H Advanced Showmanship will be allowed to compete in Master Showmanship, **to be held in the paddock area only with horses.** Showmanship for all other species will follow in the John Thurman Pavilion. The winner of FFA advanced showmanship will be allowed to compete in Master Showmanship with all other species (not including horse). Note: the two animal species limit includes horse for both 4-H and FFA exhibitors. Refer to pages M26 and M27 in the Livestock section of this handbook.
- Exhibitors must wear the official show uniform of their organization as listed below:
THE OFFICIAL 4-H UNIFORM for the Stanislaus County Fair Horse Department is as follows: BOYS – Cap, green through 8th grade, white 9th and above; white shirt with collar, short or long sleeve (long required for rabbit and when showing horses), with minimum of five buttons in front; white or off white tailored or jeans style full-length pants, green 4-H emblem tie, shoes or boots. GIRLS – May wear same as listed for boys, or may wear white blouse with same requirements as shirt, white skirt or culottes, or a white dress of similar style, green 4-H collar fastened with a simple white plastic or metal ring. APPEARANCE – Cap must be worn on head, shirt must be tucked into pants, belts must be worn if pants have loops, pants must be outside if boots are worn and 4-H collar must be over shirt collar. Baggy pants and spandex are not acceptable. English or western boots are required for horse.
OFFICIAL FFA SHOW UNIFORM for the Stanislaus County Fair Horse Department is as follows: White Trousers, white long sleeved button or snap down shirt with collar with the FFA emblem attached to the left pocket, the official FFA tie for boys, official FFA scarf for girls. The official FFA jacket is optional. If worn, the shirt emblem is not required. Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing. Western or English boots are required.
- Entry forms for Outstanding 4-H & FFA Exhibitor are available in the Horse Show Office. Judging will be on Thursday, August 6, times to be announced. Check with your advisor or leader on due dates for outstanding exhibitor entry forms.

4-H – Novice Showmanship

- Open only to 4-H members, 9 & 10 years old regardless of the number of years in 4-H.
- Previous 1st place winners of novice showmanship are not eligible to enter novice again, but may enter intermediate or advanced classes.
- Winners of 4-H Novice Showmanship in each division are eligible to enter corresponding division in class 2.

4-H Intermediate Showmanship

- Open only to 4-H members 11, 12 & 13 years old regardless of the number of years in 4-H.
- Previous 1st place winners in Intermediate Showmanship are not eligible to enter this division again, but may enter Advanced.
- Winners of 4-H Intermediate Showmanship in each division are eligible to enter corresponding division in class 3.

4-H Advanced Showmanship

1. Open to 4-H members 14 years old & over regardless of number of years in 4-H.

FFA True Novice Showmanship

1. Open to any FFA exhibitor who has never shown that species before at any organized show/fair, regardless of grade level.
2. Class winner is automatically eligible to move up to the final round of FFA Advanced Showmanship.

FFA Freshman Showmanship

1. Open to any FFA Freshman regardless of prior showing experience.
2. An exhibitor may show twice in this category. He/she may show the summer prior to their 9th grade year and the summer immediately following their 9th grade year.
3. Class winner is automatically eligible to move up to the final round of FFA Advanced Showmanship.

FFA Advanced Showmanship

1. All FFA members who do not qualify to show as True Novice or Freshman.
