GENERAL RULES (refer to specific floriculture department class section for additional rules & awards)

1. TYPE or PRINT all information except signature. **Separate entry forms must be used for each judging period and for gardens.**
2. Each entry must be listed separately and specifically. Entries in "any other" classes must be clearly specified.
3. Entries must be brought in as stated for receiving. Exhibitor names will be displayed after judging.
4. Entries must be accurately and correctly labeled. Husband and wife are considered one entrant.
5. Cut specimen classes in the Floriculture Department must have been grown by the exhibitor within the county, district or community represented by the exhibitor, except divisions for arrangements. The exhibitor must have owned potted plants for at least 60 days.
6. **All exhibitors must be out of the floriculture area by 9:30 a.m. each judging day.** Please arrive early to allow enough time before 9:30 a.m. to process your exhibitor cards/exhibits. Unless otherwise stated, buildings are closed during the judging of exhibits.
7. Exhibitors must maintain their exhibits as often as necessary on the basis they were judged. Gardens with running water or motorized movement must be maintained for the duration of fair and kept in working condition. **Premium money may be withheld if any exhibit is not maintained and kept in proper condition.** The day after fair all gardens must be leveled to a smooth terrain.
8. NOTE: Only persons licensed to sell nursery stock may sell plant materials that have been incorporated in displays.
9. All materials and decorations used in the commercial displays in the building must be made from flameproof materials or treated and maintained in a flame-retardant condition. Dyed flowers may be used. Minimum amount of painted materials allowed. May use fences, screens, dividers, concrete walls, pools, fountains, art, sculpture, wood mosaics, metal forms, mobiles etc. Height & type of structure are subject to management approval.
10. Judges are instructed to make no award where none is merited (per instructions in the State rulebook).
11. All State & Local rules apply. All General Rules at the front of this handbook apply.
12. Plants must be in clean containers, groomed and insect free. Exhibitors are encouraged to correctly label all plants with either the botanical or common name, or both. Specimen plants must be well rooted in the container.
13. Flower arranging is the art of organizing design elements (space, line form, size, color, texture, and pattern) according to the principles of design balance, proportion in regard to line, size, contrast and rhythm to attain beauty, harmony, distinction and expression.
14. Do not try for a literal interpretation of the titles. Use each title as a springboard for imaginative creativity.
15. Definitions of our local Floriculture Department for the number of **blue ribbons** an exhibitor has won: **Novice** - less than 5 ribbons
Intermediate: 6-15 ribbons, **Advanced:** 16-25 ribbons. Other Definitions are: **Open:** Any exhibitor, including judges, instructors and professionals, **Amateur:** A person who participates as a hobby rather than a profession, **Professional:** One who engages in a specific event or activity for monetary profit. Note: Having exhibited in a class, you can never enter in a lower class again.
16. Accessories are permitted to help depict a theme. All entries are displayed at the discretion of the management.
17. Exhibitors desiring special background must bring support for it which should be self-standing with back covered if displayed.
18. Fresh flowers and/or fresh plant material should be used in all arrangements unless stated otherwise. A limited amount of dry material is also permitted. Some dyed and painted materials are allowed in the Artistic Divisions when stated.
19. Arrangements must be essentially completed at home. Prep space available for last minute details only.
20. Foliage and accessories are permitted in arrangements unless otherwise noted. Succulents may be classified as foliage.
21. Mark your containers. The management will not be responsible for loss or breakage.
22. Containers are provided for cut flowers, except floated specimens and miniatures.
23. Flowers in this department should have their own foliage as it normally grows on the stem.
24. Large dahlias should be disbudded. Foliage should remain on the dahlias. Small dahlias need not be disbudded.
25. Carnations and hybrid tea roses should be disbudded.

GARDEN RULES

- Garden entry forms are due on or before Thursday, June 25, by 5 p.m. Sign ups are required AND exhibitors must register in person at the fair's exhibit office located in Building E-2.**
- TYPE or PRINT all information except signatures on garden entry form.
- All State & Local rules apply. All General Rules at the front of this handbook apply.
- Sod orders must be in Wednesday, July 22 by 12 pm, fees may apply.** Delivery will be on Tuesday, July 28.
- Exhibitors must maintain their exhibits as often as necessary on the basis they were judged. Gardens with running water or motorized movement must be maintained for the duration of fair and kept in working condition, as they were on the day judged. Garden water features must be circulating OR have a water additive. **Premium money may be withheld if any exhibit is not maintained and kept in proper condition.** The day after fair all gardens must be leveled to a smooth terrain.
- NOTE: Only persons licensed to sell nursery stock may sell plant materials that have been incorporated in displays.
- All materials and decorations used in the commercial displays in the building must be made from flameproof materials or treated and maintained in a flame-retardant condition. Dyed flowers may be used. Minimum amount of painted materials allowed. Exhibitors may use interesting fences, screens, dividers, concrete walls, pools, fountains, art, sculpture, wood mosaics, metal forms and mobiles. Height & type of structure are subject to management approval.
- Garden Landscape Plans are subject to management's approval before and during construction. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have the plot plan displayed by **Thursday, July 30 at 9 am.**
- Guidelines for plans are:
 - Garden Landscape plans will be considered in the judging of all gardens.
 - For educational purposes, plans will be displayed in or near each garden. Neatness and accuracy are encouraged.
 - Use 8 X 11 white paper (plain or graph)
 - Plan must include:
 - Theme title, division and class number on the front, lower right corner of the plan.
 - Exhibitors name written on back of the plan.
 - Design and details of garden, i.e. trees, buildings, pond, bushes, flowers, brick, etc.
 - Legend includes key to identify location and variety of plants/flowers, etc.
- Garden check – Tuesday July 28 at 10am. Berm check--Wednesday, July 29 at 10am.**
- Floriculture department will check all gardens at this time for construction process. If gardens are not at an acceptable construction point, exhibitors will be given until 5 p.m. that day to upgrade their garden. If this is not done, exhibitors forfeit their garden space and deposit. Check with the Floriculture office after 12 noon on July 28 for garden check results.
- All gardens must be completed by 8:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 29 with the exception of hand accessories.** Upon completion of the exhibit, each exhibitor must check with the superintendent for approval of all details.
- Gardens will be judged on Thursday, July 30 and released on Monday, August 10 (8 am – 1 pm). Exhibitor names and thank you signs will be displayed **after** judging.
- Judges are instructed to make no award where none is merited (per instructions in the State rulebook).
- All work and preparation for gardens must be done by the exhibitor only. Anyone found in violation of this rule will receive:**
 - Warning**
 - Second warning; may be grounds for disqualification**
- Gardens must remain for the duration of the fair. Plots are approximately 10'x 10', check with the floriculture department for exact sizes of garden plots. Limit: 1 per exhibitor.
- A deposit of \$25.00 must be paid for all adult (over 18 years) gardens when your entry form is submitted. The deposit will be refunded after fair, unless an exhibitor is in violation of the garden rules as stated in this handbook.**
