Junior Livestock Rules

1. All 2009 State Rules for California Fairs set forth by the California Department of Food & Agriculture, Division of Fairs and Expositions (F&E) apply. 2009 State rulebooks are available upon request from the Livestock Office or at <http://www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe/Staterules.htm>.
 2. The fair management shall deny entry or disqualify and remove any exhibit or exhibitor that is ineligible for competition under State and Local Rules or endangers the public or has violated State and Local rules. The fair may require removal of the exhibitor and/or exhibit (including animals) from the fairgrounds. Failure to comply shall be reported to F&E and to California network of fairs, which may be cause for any fair to deny entry of any exhibit.
 3. Exhibitors, leaders, advisors and parents found, after a chance to provide evidence and be heard before the fair management, of unethical practices as set forth in the State and Local Rules or in actions inimical with the fair program shall result in the exhibit being disqualified and the forfeiture of any awards and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances by the fair management. If the judging for the exhibit has not yet commenced the exhibitor, leaders, advisors and parents may be denied entry in any exhibitions at the fair. The fair management shall report any such incidences of unethical or inimical behavior established by the fair as provided for in this rule, to F&E in writing and such reports may become the basis for any California fair to refuse entries from the exhibitor, leaders, advisors or parents for up to 5 years following the infraction.
 4. Livestock ownership requirements: Livestock projects must be owned by and under the exhibitor's care and management and under the supervision of the organization in which the project will be shown as specified below. The official ownership date is the date shown on the receipt of sale unless the exhibitor bred the animal. The days are counted prior to the opening day of the fair.
Market Beef: A minimum of the 120 consecutive days immediately prior to the opening day of the fair.
Market Swine, Sheep, and Meat Goats: A minimum of the 60 consecutive days immediately prior to the opening day of the fair.
Registered Purebred and Grade Breeding Livestock (Beef, Dairy, Dairy Goats, Sheep, & Swine): A minimum of the 30 consecutive days immediately prior to the opening day of the fair.
One-year Replacement Heifers: A minimum of the six (6) consecutive months, immediately prior to the opening day of the fair.
Two-year Replacement Heifers: A minimum of the fourteen (14) consecutive months, immediately prior to the opening day of the fair.
 5. Under no circumstances may an exhibitor enter the same species of animal or bird (horses, beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, dairy goats, meat goats, pygmy goats, poultry, pigeons, or rabbits) in FFA, 4-H, Grange or Independent classes of the junior department per State Rules.
 6. Junior exhibitors are expected to groom and care for their own animal(s) when at the fair. Exhibitors shall refrain from accepting active assistance from adults and non-exhibiting youth unless the junior exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is only for instruction. The use of professional groomers will be cause for disqualification of the member and/or animals. Disqualification consists of withholding premium money and ribbons, elimination from further competition and/or removal from the auction. The intent of this rule is for junior exhibitors to work on their own animals.
 7. Livestock will be received beginning with goats, sheep and swine, **Sunday, August 2nd 2:00 a.m. to be in place by 8:00 a.m.** Beef and dairy will be received beginning **Sunday, August 2nd at 7:00 a.m. to be in place by 12:00 pm.**
 8. **A separate entry form must be used for each division entered by an exhibitor. Exception: Showmanship can be entered on the same entry form as the specie being shown in showmanship by the exhibitor.**
 9. Entry forms must be totally complete when received by the livestock department. When **'Papers are Pending'**, all entry information is required with the exception of the 'Name and Registration Number' of the animal being entered. **ALL OTHER INFORMATION IS REQUIRED!**
 10. All exhibitors of purebred livestock must check in their registration papers with the livestock office by 6:00 p.m. the day prior to judging of that entry. All exhibitors of any livestock must make substitutions/transfers, clear up entry deficiencies, or make ear tag/tattoo corrections by 6:00 p.m. the day prior to judging of that entry. Failure to comply with the above procedure will result in the disqualification of said entries.
 11. After the close of entries, fair management reserves the right to combine classes if sufficient entries are not received within an age group. This combination will be made after papers are checked, in order to have an accurate number of entries. **IF SUFFICIENT ENTRIES ARE NOT RECEIVED, SPECIFIED BREED WILL BE COMBINED WITH ALL OTHER BREEDS.** When the fair combines classes, an exhibitor is entitled to two cash awards per each class that was combined (**State Rule IV 6 C**).
- Limitations on Entries**
12. According to a 4-H & FFA agreement, if an animal is a 4-H project it cannot be entered in FFA classes, nor may FFA animals be entered in 4-H classes.
 13. An exhibitor is limited to entering two market animals regardless of type, but excluding poultry and single fryer rabbits. For the purpose of this rule, dairy heifers enrolled in the replacement heifer sale program will be considered as market animals.
 14. An exhibitor will be allowed to sell only one market animal.
 15. When necessary, management reserves the right to further limit junior exhibitors to the following: 9 sheep, 9 swine, 8 dairy cattle, 7 beef cattle, 12 dairy goats, 2 meat goats.
 16. No more than two species of an animal may be entered or shown per exhibitor. For this rule Dairy and Beef are considered two different species. Also Dairy Goats and Meat Goats are considered two different species. **In addition, Horse is included in the two species limit per exhibitor.**
 17. Junior exhibitors may be further limited to the number of animals that they may enter and show. This limitation will be based on the exhibitor's ability to care for and show his entries himself. An exhibitor may, if necessary, receive assistance from another Junior exhibitor who is also exhibiting at the fair.
 18. Per State Rule #5 under Section II Eligibility, a \$5.00 penalty must be paid prior to judging for each substitution made by the exhibitor in excess of two in a division.

Traffic and Credentials

19. A special gate for Livestock exhibitors is provided on Soderquist Road on the west side of the main grounds. No trucks, trailers, or automobiles will be allowed on the grounds after 8:00 a.m. daily except in designated areas. Unattended vehicles will be ticketed and/or towed away. Livestock vehicles cannot enter through gate 12 or through the arena gate 9 for entry into the fairgrounds. Livestock vehicles must use gate 13 for entry into the fairgrounds.
20. **FAIR ADMISSION**
 - **4-H, FFA, & Independent Junior Livestock Exhibitors** with entries in **Livestock, Open Poultry, or Rabbits** will be issued a **parking permit** for parking in the West Parking Lot and a **wristband** for entrance to the Fair from Friday, 7/31/09 through Sunday, 8/9/09. There is a limit of one (1) parking permit per family.
 - 4-H Leaders of Livestock, Open Poultry, and Rabbits will receive a 10-day punch card and parking permit. **There is a limit of one (1) Project Leader pass and one (1) parking permit per 4 exhibitors.**
 - **Parents/guardians of exhibitors with entries in Livestock, Open Poultry, or Rabbits** are eligible to purchase a **10-Day punch card** parent pass at a fee of \$25.00 per card. There is a limit of two (2) parent passes per family. The fees for the parent passes will be collected through the exhibitor's 4-H Club Community Leader or FFA Advisor. After the 4-H Community Leaders and FFA Advisors purchase these parent passes from the Livestock Office, they will distribute them to the appropriate exhibitors. (Not available to parents/guardians already receiving passes as 4-H Leaders, FFA Advisors, or Fair Staff.) **No passes will be sold after Monday, August 3, 2009. No refunds for parent passes.**

Pre-Fair Admission Ticket Sales: Reduced price adult admission tickets will be on sale at the fairgrounds ticket office for \$8.00 until 7:00 pm on Thursday, July 30, 2009. Regular adult admission will be \$10.00; children (age 6-12) \$3.00, and age 5 & under free.
21. No dead storage of stock trailers will be allowed in the fairground parking lots.

Market Animals

22. Limited to members residing in the 38th Agricultural District, composed of Stanislaus County and that portion of Merced County north of the Merced River served by the Turlock Irrigation District. Exhibitors desiring to show or sell market animals at the Stanislaus County Fair may not show or sell market animals (including dairy heifers) at the Chowchilla, Los Banos or Merced County Fairs, within the same calendar year. (This ruling does not apply to breeding classes.)
23. For all market animals (including dairy heifers), brand inspection requirements for cattle ownership will be enforced (CA Food & Ag Codes 21051f, 21702, 21703).
 - All replacement dairy heifer owners must surrender their bill of sale or cancelled check with brand inspection, or State of California official bill of sale/transport slip with brand inspector's verbal release date and phone number, with their dairy heifer application prior to or on the entry deadline.
 - All market beef owners must surrender a photocopy of the bill of sale OR cancelled check AND official State of California brand inspection or State of California official bill of sale/transport slip with Brand Inspector's verbal release date and phone number with their entry form prior to or on the entry deadline. **Bred by exhibitor forms will be available from the livestock office for those exhibitors that raise their own steers.**
24. There will NOT be an open period at the scales. Market animals and commercial gilts will be weighed by fair personnel on Sunday, August 2nd, with sheep, and swine and meat goats from 8:00 a.m. until completed or 12:00 noon and beef from 10:00 a.m. until completed or 12:00 noon.
25. During the official weigh-in, animals under weight limits will be identified. If the exhibitor does not plan to show the animal in showmanship it must be removed from the fairgrounds by 5:00 p.m. Sunday, August 2nd.
26. Official Breed classification WILL BE determined at the scale. ALL DECISIONS ARE FINAL!
27. **NOTE** – Castration sites shall be healed and free of inflammation.

General

28. **EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE & PROVIDE INSURANCE FOR ALL ANIMALS AT THE FAIR. PLEASE REFER TO PAGE A1 OF THIS HANDBOOK FOR COMPLETE INFORMATION.**
29. COOLER FANS AND OTHER APPLIANCES MUST BE EQUIPPED WITH A THREE-WIRE GROUND. STATE FIRE MARSHALL WILL INSPECT FOR COMPLIANCE AT ANY GIVEN TIME. VIOLATORS WILL BE RELEASED FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS IMMEDIATELY.
30. **NEW:** NO CHRISTMAS LIGHTS OR RADIOS ARE ALLOWED AT ANY TIME ON THE FAIRGROUNDS.
31. Blocking chutes are required to have secure floors.
32. Nose rings are recommended for senior bull calves and older, for the safety of all exhibitors.
33. **Exhibitors will be limited to the hay and bedding on the grounds that is needed for each day. No dumps (or squeezes) of hay or straw will be allowed.**
34. Soiled bedding must be placed in manure boxes and barns must be ready for fairgoers by 9:00 a.m. daily.
35. Market Sheep must be slick-shorn prior to arrival at the fair.
36. All FFA and 4-H members receiving awards at the awards ceremony must be in the official show uniform of that organization.
37. There will be a \$20.00 fee for each check that must be reissued by the Fair.
38. An exhibitor must show their own animals unless the exhibitor has 2 entries in the same class. In this case an exhibitor may receive assistance from another junior exhibitor who is also an exhibitor at the fair and is in official show uniform at the time of rendering assistance. An exhibitor may utilize assistance for group classes, however all assistants must be junior exhibitors at the fair and be in official show uniform.
39. Project record books must be available on request.
40. **NECK SAFETY TIES WILL BE REQUIRED ON ALL BEEF AND DAIRY ANIMALS.**
41. No drenching (force filling) of any animal is allowed. **Drench guns are not approved for use while on fairgrounds. Anyone found to be using a drench gun, without the supervision and direction of the official fair veterinarian and/or designated fair official, may result in exhibit being disqualified.**
42. No junior exhibitors will be permitted in the livestock area after 11:00 p.m. Fair management does not encourage and cannot assume the responsibility for junior exhibitors remaining after 11:00 p.m. on the fairgrounds or parking area.

43. Parents/leaders assistance is allowed in the cleaning of barn area prior to 9:00 a.m. This is in the interest of getting barn area cleaned earlier.
44. To improve housekeeping in the Junior Livestock department, by order of the State Fire Marshall, junior exhibitors will not be permitted to sleep, or store personal effects, other than show tack, in the area. No feed or tack in pens or stalls. Show boxes are not to be put in tie spaces. Subject to a \$50.00 per day fine.
45. The fair will not provide first bedding for any species.
46. The use of shavings is prohibited except in the Junior Swine, Junior Sheep and/or Junior Goat Divisions. Infraction of this rule is cause for disqualification and/or withholding of premium monies.
47. Tie stalls are assigned to animals on exhibit only.
48. All animals in "registered purebred breeding animal" divisions must be registered and recorded with a United States (U.S.) breed association in the exact name of the exhibitor (owner) as declared on the entry form, except for:
- Pigs, 12 months or younger, which are still owned by the breeder. Litter registrations are acceptable if recorded with their breed association and if they identify the litter by birth date, sire, dam and ear notching; and
 - Animals whose breed association requires an inspector's approval before registering. The animal cannot be more than 12 months of age on the opening day of the fair. Exhibitors may present a statement by the secretary of the association stating that the animal is eligible to be registered. This statement must identify the animal by birth date, sire, dam, and ear tag, tattoo or notching.
49. Original registration certificates, a stamped duplicate issued by a U.S. breed association, or other documents mentioned above must be presented to the management when the animals arrive on the fairgrounds and must be kept on hand.
- Original registration certificates faxed to the fair by the U.S. breed association will also be accepted and retained by the fair. Photocopies, letters, and telegrams are not acceptable.
 - Clerks are instructed to correct entry records exactly as shown on the certificate. Any exceptions will be based solely upon the recognized U.S. breed association's standard practices for issuing registration certificates. A written verification from the association of any deviation in issuing practices must be on file with F&E.
50. No deviation from or alteration in the information on a registration certificate will be permitted unless clearance in writing is first obtained from the breed association that issued the certificate. Evidence of any attempt to alter information on a registration certificate shall be reported immediately to F&E and may become the basis for any California fair to refuse entries from the exhibitor and/or its agent.
51. The highest standard for each particular Breed's Association National Show will be used as the standards in the Fair's Breeding Shows. By contacting the Livestock Office an exhibitor may attain information on Show standards for 'All Other Breeds'.
- ABERDEEN ANGUS: Registry by the American Angus Association required.
- BRAHMAN: Registry in the American Brahman Breeders Association required.
- CHAROLAIS: Registry in the American-International Charolais Association required. Not less than 96.875% (31/32) Charolais is accepted as purebred.
- HEREFORD: Registry in the American Hereford Association or the American Polled Hereford Association required. Must be 100% Hereford.
- LIMOUSIN: Registry in the American Limousin Foundation requires 87% (7/8) Limousin or above.
- MAINE-ANJOU: Registry in the International Maine-Anjou Association required: 75% (3/4) Maine-Anjou or above.
- RED ANGUS: Registry in the American Red Angus Association of American, Inc. required. Red Angus in category 1A (100%) and category 1B (87%-99%) will be able to show.
- SHORTHORN: Registry in the American Shorthorn Association required.
- Any other Breeds approved by management

56. Volume level of radio, tape players, etc. must not interfere with Fair's P.A. system, other exhibitors, etc. Failure to comply with this rule will be cause for removal of said device and may be cause for the withholding of premiums.
57. All portable scales must be removed from grounds no later than Sunday, August 2nd, at 5:00 p.m.
58. Barbecues are prohibited on fairgrounds.
59. **MILK PARLOR RULES AND INFORMATION:**
- There will be a mandatory meeting of all dairy exhibitors that plan to milk in the milk parlor on **Sunday, August 2nd at 5:00 p.m.** To milk in the milk parlor you must sign up with the Barn Supervisor during this mandatory meeting. Milking schedule will be on a first come first serve basis.
 - Exhibitors must milk their own cows unless other arrangements are made with the Barn Supervisor.
 - In order to put milk in the tank, an exhibitor must milk in the parlor.
 - For exhibitor convenience there will be provisions made to milk any treated cows in the parlor. Note: this milk will not go into the tank.

- E. The milk barn will close down each day at 8:00 a.m. to test the milk and to prepare for creamery pickup. Once the milk is picked up and the tank is cleaned the milk barn will once again open.
 - F. Any antibiotics in the tank will be cause for the entire tank of milk to be dumped.
 - G. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know if their cow(s) have been treated with controlled substances (i.e.: antibiotics, etc.). If an exhibitor milks a treated cow into the milk tank that exhibitor may be financially responsible for the value of the entire tank of contaminated milk.
 - H. There will be spot checks to detect any antibiotics. If for any reason a tank of milk is dumped each cow will be tested at the next milking.
60. Independent Livestock Exhibitors
- A. Independent Junior is an exhibitor not eligible to compete in a certain category as a member of a 4-H, Grange or FFA junior organization.
 - B. Independent Exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2009. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
 - C. Independent exhibitors must enter an open junior or independent class unless one is not available. If an open junior or independent class is not available, junior exhibitors may enter an appropriate 4-H, FFA or Grange class. Fair Management may determine the division and/or class placement of Independents.
 - D. Liability insurance is required, of all Independent Junior Livestock Exhibitors, for the duration of the fair. Liability insurance coverage is available for purchase through the fair office.**
 - E. Juniors who have been 4-H, FFA or Grange project members within 60 days (120 days for horse and market beef, 180 days for dairy replacement heifer) prior to the fair are not eligible to compete in that project as independent juniors or enter project(s) under a different organization.
 - F. Independent junior exhibitors entering market animals must provide Fair management with a picture of their animal, appropriate proof of ownership and permanent tag, tattoo and/or hog ear notch information 180 days prior to the fair for dairy replacement heifers, 120 days prior to fair for beef, and 60 days for sheep, swine, and meat goats.
 - G. Independent Exhibitors must have "on ground" supervision by a responsible adult.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

RAY SOUZA, Auction Committee Chair

1. An Auction sale of Junior Market Livestock will be held on the Stanislaus County Fairgrounds following an awards presentation at 8:00 a.m., Saturday August 8, 2009.
2. Eligibility: The program will be available to all 4-H and FFA members in the 38th District Agricultural area. The animal must be a part of a bona fide market project, which means any member carrying this project must be enrolled in a 4-H Club, be a member of a FFA Chapter, or be a qualified Independent exhibitor.
3. Only Market Lambs, Market Steers, and Market Meat Goats that are officially judged and classified as Market Ready, and Market Hogs officially judged and classified as Market Acceptable, while being exhibited at the Stanislaus County Fair in the judging rings will be eligible for sale. All Group 1 Rabbit Meat Pens will be eligible for sale. 4-H & FFA Grand & Reserve Grand Champion Poultry Meat Pens and 4-H & FFA Grand & Reserve Grand Champion Single Fryer Rabbits will be eligible for sale.
4. Limit: Junior exhibitors will be limited to the sale of one (1) animal. Participants in the dairy heifer sale note Junior Livestock Rule #13. Poultry Grand Champion Meat Pens and Grand Champion Single Fryer Rabbits are excluded from the (1) market animal rule.
5. There will be a 5% selling charge collected on all livestock sold to defray expenses of the auction, operations of the sale committee, and to provide a contingency fund required by the state, against possible losses. Checks will be provided through the generosity of the County Bank.
6. Junior exhibitors must declare within one hour after the end of the market show for that species in which the exhibitor is showing, whether they will consign their animal to the Junior Livestock Auction. If the decision is "yes", the animal will be automatically consigned to the Stanislaus County Fair Livestock Auction Committee for sale. If the decision is "no", the exhibitor must turn in to the Livestock Office a signed release to NOT sell a market animal. **NO ANIMAL CONSIGNED MAY BE WITHDRAWN FROM THE AUCTION.** All state rules apply.
7. For the purpose of this Junior Livestock Auction, the following Champions will be selected. All Champions so selected are 'REQUIRED' to be consigned to the Junior Livestock Auction and offered for sale through the ring.
 - SUPREME AND RESERVE SUPREME CHAMPION
Steer, Hog, Lamb, and Meat Goat
 - FFA GRAND AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION
Steer, Hog, Lamb, and Meat Goat
 - 4-H GRAND AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION
Steer, Hog, Lamb, and Meat Goat
8. **Exhibitors are required to sell their own animal and be in complete, official 4-H and/or FFA show uniform when selling.**
9. It shall be the seller's responsibility to maintain and care for animals, pens and stalls through 11:00 p.m. Saturday, August 8, 2009 unless the animals involved have been gathered for shipment before that time. All state rules apply.

10. Animals (market and breeding) on the fairgrounds may be blood tested by the state. Sale prices and/or premiums may be withheld pending blood testing results. Sellers are responsible for animals rejected at processing center due to the presence of drug residues.
11. No premium money will be paid on any animal that is sold through the auction.
12. NOTE! – Ear tags for all entries in the market animal classes will be ready at the Livestock office July 16, 2009. All ear tags MUST be picked up by July 23, 2009.
13. The following are acceptable ways to pay for a Junior Livestock Auction Purchase: CASH, CHECK, VISA OR MASTERCARD.
14. Auction accounts are due and payable within 30 days of billing. Accounts past due (30 days or more) may be charged a \$25.00 late fee.
15. Buyers with three (3) occurrences of returned checks for non-sufficient funds will not be able to obtain a buyer number at future Stanislaus County Fair's Jr. Livestock Auctions.
16. Buyers with prior outstanding Auction balances of 60 days or more will not be issued a buyer number to purchase animals.

STANISLAUS COUNTY JUNIOR DAIRY REPLACEMENT HEIFER PROGRAM

Purpose of the program and sale is to provide 4-H and FFA members an opportunity to:

1. Learn how to select a dairy heifer (heifer calf) that has the potential of being a good producing cow.
2. Learn how to raise good quality dairy animals, demonstrating approved management principles.
3. Offer for sale a top quality dairy replacement heifer at the conclusion of the program if they desire.
4. Give non-dairy farm members an opportunity to gain valuable experience in dairy husbandry.

2009 SALE

The 42nd annual Stanislaus County Replacement Heifer Sale will be held on Friday, August 7, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. in the Thurman Pavilion Barn 6.

REPLACEMENT HEIFER SALE

1. The following are acceptable ways to pay for a Replacement Heifer Purchase: CASH, CHECK, VISA, MASTERCARD or DISCOVER.
2. Auction accounts are due and payable within 30 days of billing. Accounts past due (30 days or more) may be charged a \$25.00 late fee.
3. Buyers with three (3) occurrences of returned checks for non-sufficient funds, will not be allowed to bid or purchase at future Stanislaus County Fair Sales or Auctions.
4. Buyers with any outstanding Auction balances of 90 days or more will not be allowed to bid or purchase at future Stanislaus County Fair Sales or Auctions.

RULES

There will be a 5% selling charge collected on all heifers sold to defray expenses of the auction, operations of the sale committee & to provide a contingency fund required by the state, against losses. Exhibitors that meet the criteria listed below will be entitled to a 2% reduction on the selling fee.

2-year projects: In order for an exhibitor to be eligible to sell a heifer in the current year Stanislaus County Fair Replacement Heifer Sale as a two-year project the heifer must:

1. Be owned by, and under the care and management of, the exhibitor for a minimum of the fourteen (14) consecutive months immediately prior to the opening date of the current year's fair.
2. Be officially entered in the appropriate class the previous year using the 1st year of a 2-year Replacement Heifer application.
3. Be shown in the appropriate class at the Stanislaus County Fair by the same exhibitor the previous year.
4. Be officially entered the current year using the 2nd year of a 2-year Replacement Heifer application, and
5. Be exhibited and officially judged in the show ring by the current year dairy judge.

ALL SALES FINAL! Removal of heifer from the Fairgrounds constitutes acceptance by the buyer.

EXHIBITORS MUST COMPLETE & SUBMIT THE OFFICIAL REPLACEMENT HEIFER ENTRY FORM AND THE OFFICIAL LIVESTOCK ENTRY FORM BY THE ENTRY DEADLINE. THIS INCLUDES, 1-YEAR PROJECTS, AND THE 1ST & 2ND YEAR OF TWO-YEAR PROJECTS.

ELIGIBILITY

The program will be available to all 4-H and FFA members and qualified Independent exhibitors residing within the 38th District Agricultural Association. The heifer must be a part of a bona fide dairy project, which means any member carrying this project must be enrolled in a 4-H Club Dairy project, be a member of a FFA Chapter, or be a qualified Independent exhibitor.

REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible to sell a heifer through the Replacement Heifer sale an exhibitor must:

1. Be the owner of the heifer, and be under the supervision of the organization in which the project will be shown, a minimum of the consecutive six months (fourteen months for 2-year projects) immediately prior to the opening day of the current year's fair.
2. Enter the heifer with the program committee by the current year's due dates and
3. The heifer must be entered and judged at the current year's Stanislaus County Fair.
4. Exhibitors are required to sell their own heifer and be in complete, official 4-H or FFA show uniform when selling.

HEIFER APPLICATIONS MUST BE COMPLETED AND SUBMITTED TO THE FAIR OFFICE ON OR BEFORE 5:00 P.M. ON THURSDAY, JANUARY 29, 2009 FOR ALL 1-YEAR HEIFER PROJECTS AND FOR THE 2ND YEAR OF ALL 2-YEAR PROJECTS.

HEIFER APPLICATIONS FOR THE 1ST YEAR OF A 2-YEAR PROJECT, (animals that are showing, not selling this year) MUST BE COMPLETED AND SUBMITTED TO THE FAIR OFFICE NO LATER THAN 5:00 P.M., THURSDAY JUNE 4, 2009. HEIFER APPLICATIONS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE FAIR OFFICE OR SEE YOUR DAIRY LEADER OR ADVISOR.

If for unforeseen reasons the project is terminated before the sale (to be held as a part of the 2009 fair) the original owner must be given first opportunity to purchase the heifer.

HEIFERS ARE INCLUDED IN THE MARKET RULE – Exhibitors are allowed to sell only one market animal at the Stanislaus County Fair.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ANIMALS

Exhibitors have two options when selecting grade dairy heifers for the Replacement Heifer Program. Option one is to purchase a heifer that is old enough to breed, or is already bred, to freshen within 90 days after the current year's fair (One-Year Project). Option two is to purchase a young dairy heifer that may qualify as a two-year project.

Two-year projects must be entered and shown in their appropriate class at the Stanislaus County Fair the 1st and 2nd year of the project by the same exhibitor. In addition to the requirements above, heifers must be:

1. Sired by a registered bull of same breed as its dam. The dam must have no history of cross breeding.
2. Out of a dam that has good-type and has produced at least 700 lbs. of butterfat in 305 days or less. If the dam has two or less completed 305-day lactations, complete lactation mature equivalent may be used to fulfill this requirement. It will be noted in the sale catalog if ME is used.
3. Identified by the DHIA accepted number with a LEGIBLE California Brucellosis tattoo. **Any heifer without a legible California Brucellosis tattoo will be disqualified from the show and sale and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately.**
4. Born on or after March 1st two years prior to the year the heifer will be sold.
5. Identified by photographs. Exhibitor is required to provide three photos of their heifer, approximately 3 x 5:
 - (1) Left side & Right side profile of the heifer, AND
 - (2) Front view of the heifer
6. The entry/application will not be accepted without required photographs of the animal entered. In addition Jerseys must be identified by ear tattoo.
7. Bred to a registered bull of the same breed or, if not, the breed of the sire must be listed on the entry.
8. Guaranteed by the seller (exhibitor):
 - a. To be open in all four quarters at the time of the sale
 - b. Vaccinated for brucellosis
 - c. Should be vaccinated for Rednose & Leptospirosis within a year of sale
 - d. To have been dehornedA veterinarian will check each heifer on the fairgrounds prior to the sale. The decision of the veterinarian will be final (Refer to State Rule X. 4.).
9. Heifers must be fit and in show condition for judging and sale. Each heifer will show in the appropriate replacement heifer class at the fair. Those not measuring up to expected condition and breed type will not be allowed to sell through the sale, but may be sold at private treaty after the sale.
10. Heifers selected for this project must have sufficient growth and development with the relation to age and be bred to freshen no later than 90 days after the sale.
11. Registered and accepted with the Project Committee on proper forms provided for that purpose by the office of the Stanislaus County Fair prior to the deadlines stated under heifer requirements. **There will be absolutely no substitutions of animals after the application deadline as stated in the heifer requirements.**
12. Any replacement heifer that calves prior to the Sunday 2:00 p.m. heifer check will not be allowed to sell through the sale at the Stanislaus County Fair. The heifer may be transferred and exhibited in the appropriate grade class.
13. All registered animals must have papers cancelled by sale date and be sold as a grade animal. Proof of cancelled papers must be with entry.
14. Members are encouraged to insure their animals.
15. The Committee must be informed of any antibiotics administered to heifer prior to sale.
16. No premium money will be paid on any animal that is sold through the auction.
17. Exhibitor must submit a copy of the bill of sale OR cancelled check AND a brand inspector's release with their dairy heifer application.
18. Exhibitors must submit a copy of the DHIA record or of the private test record of the heifer's dam with their application. Actual DHIA individual cow test sheets are most ideal, however computer generated DHIA printouts from other programs are acceptable as follows: Computer generated DHIA records or Private Test printouts must include the following information for the Dam of the heifer: Dam's Events sheet (page 1 of Dairy Comp 305); the Dam's History sheet (page 2 of Dairy Comp 305); and the Dam's Production sheet (page 5 of Dairy Comp 305). The same three pages for the Heifer being entered must also be supplied. For DHI+ the Identification and Vital Statistics page for the Dam and the Heifer, along with the Previous Lactation/Production page for the Dam, must be supplied. If a dairy management program, other than Dairy Comp 305 or DHI+ is used, the pages that supply the same information as described above is required. It will be specified in the sale catalog if your record was an official DHIA test or a private test.
19. **On Sunday, August 2nd, from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. All Heifers selling through the 2009 Auction will:**
 - A. Go through a veterinary health check for pregnancy confirmation, udder soundness, Brucellosis vaccination tattoo verification, and a check of general health and soundness. During this check any heifer found:
 1. Without a valid, legible Brucellosis tattoo;
 2. Open, or not bred to calf within 90 days of the auction;
 3. Blind in one or more quarters;
 4. Or for other detrimental health reasons as determined by the veterinarian(s) will be disqualified from the sale. Any heifer found without a valid, legible Brucellosis tattoo will be sent home immediately. Other heifers on the recommendation of the veterinarian(s) may be sent home. (The decision of the veterinarian will be final (refer to State Rule X. 4.)
 - B. Have the State Brand Inspector perform a brand inspection on each heifer.
 - C. Have a picture review verification of all heifers by Members of the Stanislaus County Fair Heifer Committee.

If swine are imported directly from states classified Pseudorabies Eradication Program Stage I, II or III, a negative Pseudorabies test is required within 30 days before entry into California. **These swine must be isolated from other swine and cannot be exhibited until retested and found negative 30 to 60 days after entering California.**
3. A regular California entry permit will not be granted for swine vaccinated for Pseudorabies. However, AHFSS, CDFAs may grant a special California entry permit with specific limitation for such swine.

9. Market sheep under the 100-pound minimum weight will be weight sifted. If the exhibitor does not plan to show the animal in showmanship it must be removed from the fairgrounds by 5:00 p.m. Sunday, August 2nd.
10. Market sheep exceeding the 145-pound top weight limit will show together in a super-heavy-weight class. Desirable market weight will be a consideration in market animal judging.

4. Animals must be registered in exhibitor's name on or before MAY 24, 2009.
5. Any goat showing pronounced defects, contagious conditions, or abnormalities may not show.
6. All animals must be able to be led and handled in show ring.
7. Animal must be groomed, bathed and arrive in show condition. Fitting is at the discretion of the exhibitor; no artificial coloring allowed.
8. Birthdates as listed on registration certificate will determine classes. Classes may be combined at the discretion of the show chair.
9. Only animals that have shown in individual classes are eligible to be in group classes. Showmanship animals must be shown by exhibitor showing and also be entered in individual class.
10. Judging will reflect breed standards that are available at www.intlboergoat.org and look under "members" and then "forms" tabs.
11. No bedding provided by the Fair; shavings are preferred.
12. Exhibitors will be required to adhere to the Independent Exhibitor Uniform Policy.
13. Open to Stanislaus County 4-H, FFA, or independent youth.

1. Post entries will NOT be accepted.
2. Only animals owned, fitted and entered by the exhibitor in the Junior Department Livestock division, under the provisions of **State Rule Section VII, Rule 30** are eligible.
3. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time called for judging. NOTE: Exhibitors must wear the official show uniform of their organization.
4. Weight and market grade sifted animals may be shown in showmanship.

4-H True Novice Showmanship

1. All advanced showmanship winners are required to participate in master showmanship. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of premiums.
2. Open to winners of 4-H & FFA Advanced Showmanship, (**Classes 3 & 6 of all Divisions**), and to the 4-H/FFA winners of Advanced Showmanship in the Horse Department.
3. All previous Master Showmanship Winners at this fair are excluded from this contest.
4. The format for the Master Showmanship contest will be contestants competing in seven rounds. Each round will include 7 animals of one type, from the following livestock species: a) Beef Cattle, b) Dairy Cattle, c) Swine, d) Sheep, e) Dairy Goat, f) Meat Goat, & g) Horse. (**Horse will not be shown by FFA**)
5. The Livestock Superintendent will select the animals.
